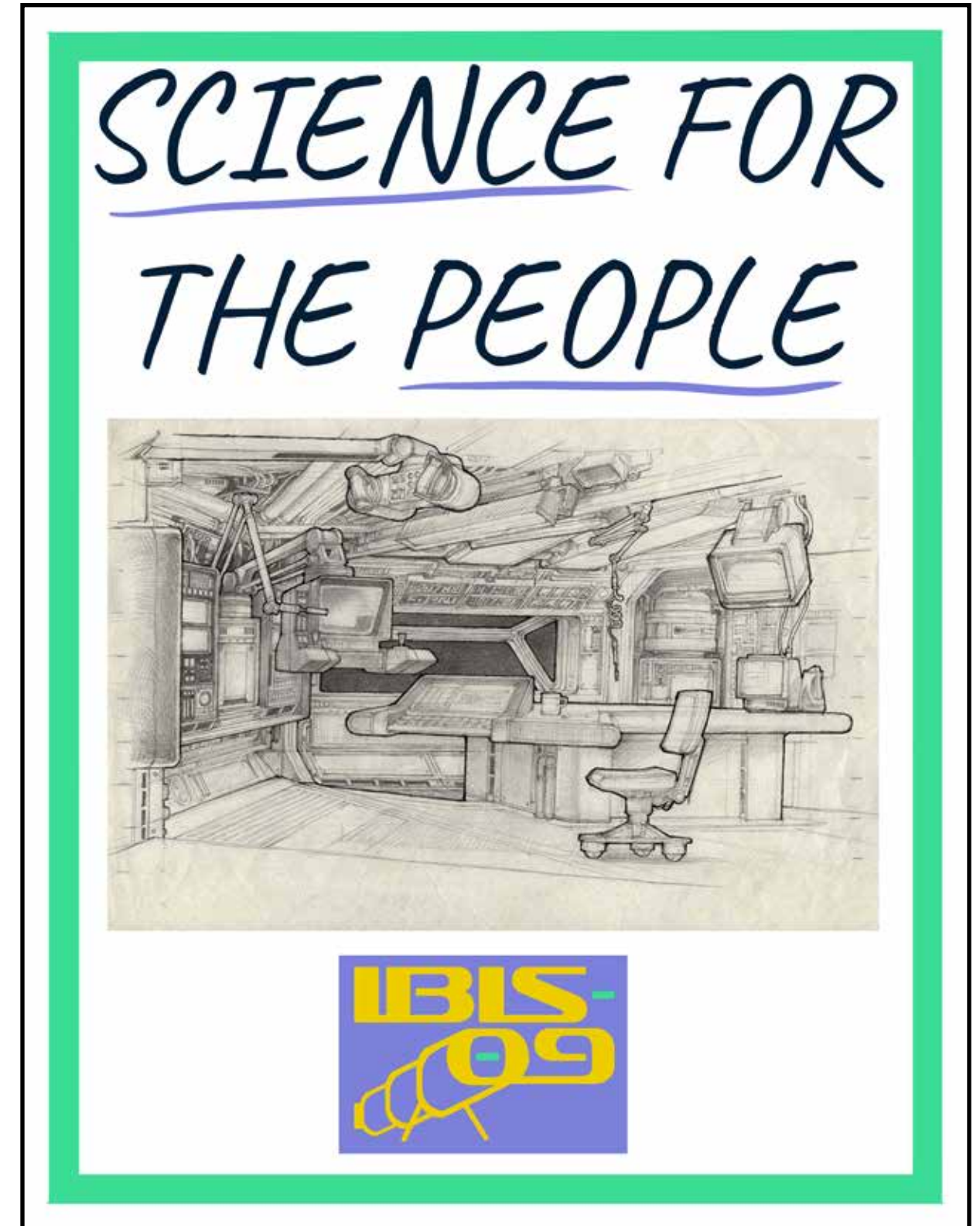
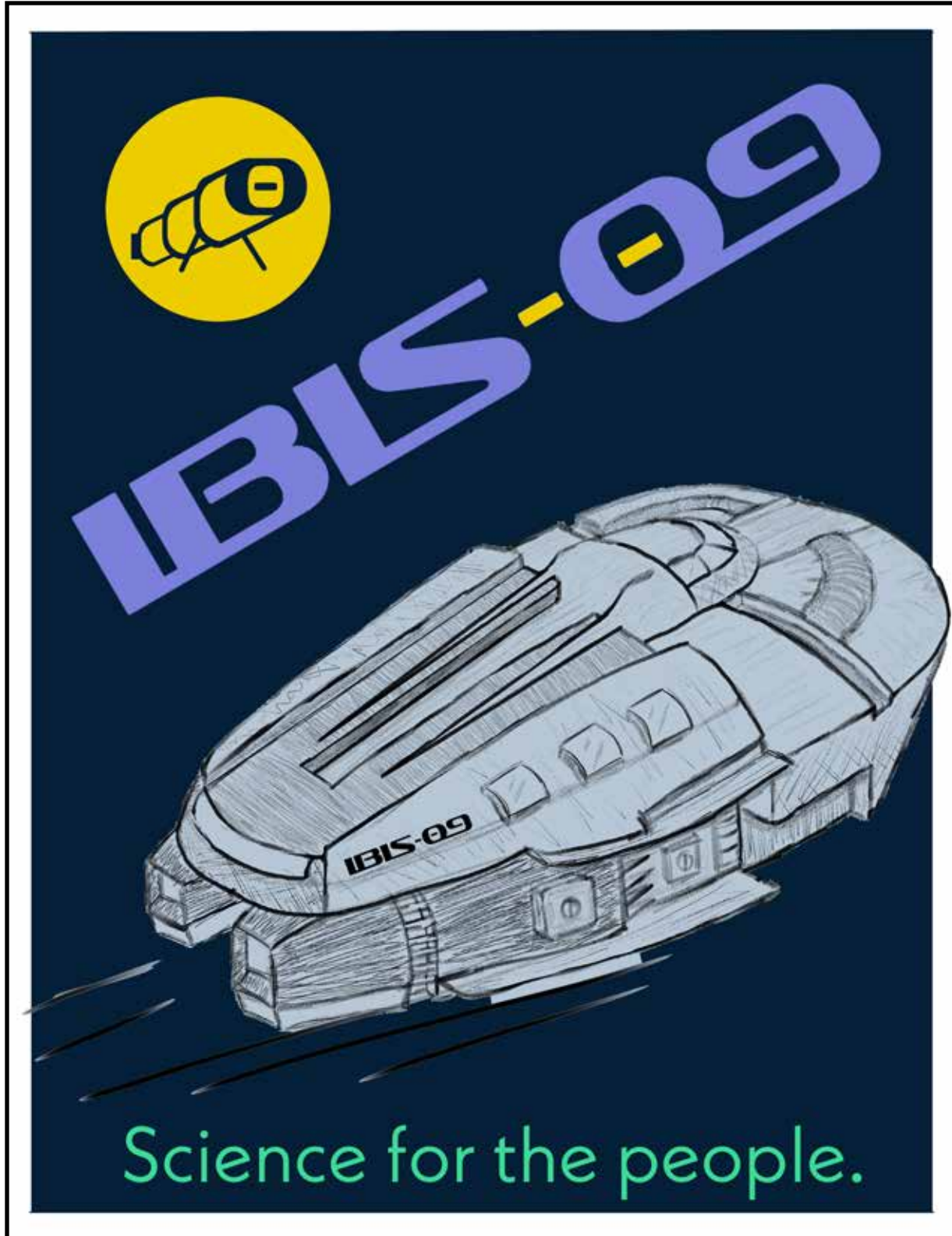
COMMUNITY OWNED
